



ANNOUNCING LILLY GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS in Humanities and the Arts

You are embarking on an adventure. Pursuing a graduate degree in humanities or the arts will push your creativity to its limits as you refine your mind and cultivate your identity as a scholar, a professor, a teacher. Of course, you won't do this alone; the faculty at your graduate institution, fellow students, and other mentors—in short, a network of colleagues—will help you meet your potential.

The Lilly Graduate Fellows Program in Humanities and the Arts extends this network of colleagues beyond your individual graduate program into a community of scholars interested in research and teaching within Protestant and Catholic institutions of higher education. Within this network you will find colleagues and mentors who integrate scholarship, research, and a vocational interest in Christian Higher Education, and who will challenge and support you as you move from your undergraduate experience, through your graduate program, and then into a professional career among scholars who integrate faith and learning.

The Three Year Program

The Lilly Graduate Fellows Program will select a cohort of 15 Fellows who are entering graduate school in the fall, 2008. Over a three year period, these Fellows, along with two senior mentors, will communicate and collaborate with each other in areas of research, teaching, and professional development.

- Lilly Graduate Fellows will participate in 4 conferences over the course of three years. These conferences will allow Fellows to collaborate with each other and with senior scholars and luminaries who integrate research, teaching, vocation, and an interest in Protestant and Catholic higher education.
- Lilly Graduate Fellows will develop a relationship with a mentor who is a senior scholar at a Lilly Fellows Program Network School.
- Lilly Graduate Fellows and mentors will participate in group readings and online discussions over the course of the three year program.
- Lilly Graduate Fellows will receive 3 annual \$3,000 stipends for use at the Fellows' discretion

Application Procedures and Eligibility

Eligible candidates must be nominated by their undergraduate institutions. To be considered for nomination, please submit your application to the LFP Campus Representative listed below no later than **November 21, 2007**. The Campus Representative will give you further information. Once nominated, application materials are due **February 1, 2008**.
